WSU Credit-Hour Defined	A credit-hour is an amount of work represented in intended learning outcomes and verified by evidence of student achievement that reasonably approximates not less than:  1) One hour of classroom or direct faculty instruction and a minimum of two hours of out-of-class student work each week, for approximately fifteen weeks for one semester-hour of credit, or the equivalent of amount of work over a different amount of time; or  2) At least an equivalent amount of work for other activities, including laboratory work, internships, practica, studio work, and other academic work leading to the award of credit-hours.

Medical Insurance	All J-1 international students and scholars whose DS-2019 was issued by Wayne State University are required to enroll in the Wayne State University Student/Scholar Health Insurance plan. Students should not purchase health insurance in their home country, in many instances it will not comply with J-1 visa benefit level regulations issued by the U.S. Department of State.

Routine care, illness care, preventative medicine and behavioral health support are available. The international medical insurance plan is accepted, deductible and copay fees may apply.	
Tuberculosis (TB) Testing	https://oip.wayne.edu/oiss/health-wellness/tb-test To ensure a healthy campus Wayne State University is requiring mandatory Tuberculosis (TB) testing for new and continuing international students. The international student medical insurance plan will pay for the TB testing and evaluation fees. Students may bring a negative TB test result dated within 30 days of their arrival to WSU in lieu of having the blood test taken at the Campus Health Center. A TB Evaluation Appointment at Campus Health will be provided to each student on their Welcome Week Schedule.

J-1 Visa Fees	\$220 I-901 SEVIS Fee, \$50 Institutional SEVIS Fee per semester, \$185 DS-160 Application Fee, Medical Insurance Fee varies by semester (see website link above).	
J-1 Cost of Attendance	\$9,474 per semester – must provide proof of this amount in funding for a J-1 visa	
J-1 Visa Check-In	Mandatory Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS) J-1 Visa Check-In: Students must attend an OISS Check-In during Welcome Week. Students will be provided with a Welcome Week Schedule and Events list before they arrive to the U.S., this appointment will be indicated.	
Exchange Orientation	All new exchange students will attend an <b>Exchange Program Orientation</b> during Welcome Week. Study Abroad staff will provide each student an individual Welcome Week Itinerary before they arrive (based on their arrival date to WSU - within arrival date guidelines above).	
Student Ambassadors	Inbound exchange students will be assigned a student ambassador to help with questions and settling in.
